



## Historic Kilbride Heritage Trail Development



### What will the placement involve?

The Friends of Kilbride in partnership with Heritage Horizons are offering a 12-week placement to support the development of a digital, self-led heritage trail at the Historic Environment Scheduled Monument site of Historic Kilbride. The digital trail aims to provide an interactive and engaging visitor experience to the ancient site with a rich history. The site's usage spans from the early Middle Ages, from one of Argyll's important early churches, the Church of Saint Bride the Virgin in Lorn, to the resting place of the Chiefs of Clan MacDougall since 1737.

Working under the guidance and support of many members of the Friends of Kilbride ([www.friendsofkilbride.scot](http://www.friendsofkilbride.scot)), this creative project will involve research, documentation, interpretation, and video making to digitally tell the story of the site through time.

Participants are required to document their work and experiences digitally (via vlogs, social media, blogs or videos). All training will be provided. Support and funding are available to cover all project expenses (e.g. travel costs) and the required materials and resources.



### Where and for how long?

The placement will require both remote working from home and on site at Historic Kilbride for a duration of up to 12-weeks commencing in Autumn-Winter 2021.
