What will it involve?

Are you aged between 16 and 25 and interested in art and heritage? Join artist Sandi Kiehlmann for zine making workshops exploring the history of Dunoon Burgh Hall. Over nine sessions you will learn about the history and heritage of Dunoon Burgh Hall, explore artistic approaches such as sketching, printmaking, and digital drawing, and get the opportunity to create your own zine! In addition, you'll also be supported to achieve a Trinity College London Bronze Level Arts Award. This is a nationally recognised certificate which reflects your learning throughout the project.

The sessions will be led by local artist Sandi Kiehlmann. Sandi will help you explore different artforms.


Local heritage

To achieve a Bronze Arts Award, young people collect evidence in an individual portfolio of their experiences of:

- Developing their interests, knowledge and skills through actively participating in any art form
- Experiencing at least one arts event/experience as an audience member and their review of that event/experience
- Researching the career and work of an artist or craftsman that inspires them
- Experience of passing on an arts skill

Funding


