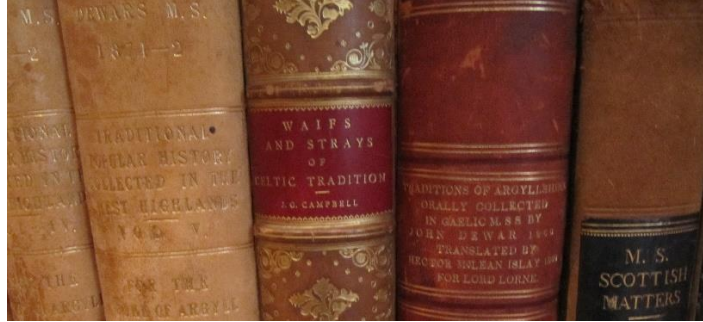


Tìr Ìseal nan Òran (Tìree low land of song)

Sgeulachdan Tiristeach Iain Mhic an Deòir / John Dewar's Tìree Stories

Thug Iain Mac an Deòir (1802–72), a bhuineadh dhan Arthar, na bliadhnan 1860–72 a’ siubhal Earraghaidheal agus cearnaidhean eile den Ghaidhealtachd, ag éisteachd ri sgeulachdan eachdraidheil agus gan sgrìobhadh ann an Gàidhlig. Se toradh na h-obrach deich làmh-sgrìobhainnean anns a bheil eachdraidh nan daoine bho thimcheall air 1308 gu 1752, air a h-innse ’nan cànan fhéin. Tha seachd dhiubh an Inbhir Aora agus trì an Dùn Éideann, le corr math agus 4,000 duilleag de sgrìobhadh. Tha obair orra a’ dol air adhart gu math mar phròiseact co-obrachail, le sùil ri sreath leabhraichean. Tha ceithir sgeulachdan deug ann mu Thiriodh, cho math ri stuth eile a bhuineas ris an eilean. Thèid na sgeulachdan seo innse gu goirid, le pàirtean ann am faclan Mhic an Deòir agus pàirtean giorraichte, agus bheirear cunntas air na Tiristich a thug do Mhac an Deòir iad. Sann an Gàidhlig a bhios an òraid, le eadar-theangachadh co-aimsireil gu Beurla.

John Dewar (1802–72), a Gaelic speaker from Arrochar, spent the years 1860–72 going around Argyll and other parts of the Highlands, listening to historical tales and writing them down in Gaelic. The result is a superb collection of ten manuscripts containing the people’s history of the West Highlands from about 1308 to 1752, told in their own language. Seven of these are in Inveraray and three are Edinburgh, with well over 4,000 pages of writing. Work on them is well under way as a collaborative project, and a series of books is planned. There are fourteen stories about Tìree, along with other material relating to the island. These stories will be told briefly, partly in Dewar’s words and partly in abbreviated form, and an account will be given of Dewar’s Tìree informants. The lecture will be in Gaelic, with simultaneous translation into English.
